Disperse Blue 106

Your TRUE TEST® indicates that you have a contact allergy to disperse blue 106.

Disperse blue 106 in contact with your skin may result in dermatitis. Brief or occasional contact may not pose a problem.

Where is disperse blue 106 found?

Disperse blue 106 is a dark blue textile dye found in fabrics colored dark blue, brown, black, purple, and some greens. Disperse blue 106 is frequently found in the 100% acetate and 100% polyester fabrics, but may also be found in bedding, nylon stockings, swimming suits, and tights.

How to avoid disperse blue 106

Avoid those materials as mentioned above. As it is not always possible to avoid them wash new clothing or bed linens multiple times before use. Wear fabric made of natural fibers such as silk, wool, and cotton whenever possible.

If you suspect that you are being exposed to this allergen at work, consult your employer.

Inform your healthcare providers that you are allergic to disperse blue 106.
